Join us for the Intriguing Sherlock Holmes Exhibit and the Wonderful Whale Movie.

We'll meet in the Lobby at 2:30P for the 3P whale movie (you can come earlier if you want to see the new exhibits on Race and Questionable Medical Devices). These huge mammals can weigh up to 40 tons; they have at least 5 types of songs (males only); they love to jump (breach); there are 15 different groups and they migrate tens of thousands of miles. Wait until you see their "bubble net" method for feeding on krill and small fish.

After the movie, step into a scene from Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's Victorian London and join the world's most famous detective in solving a baffling mystery. Presented chapter by chapter, this interactive short story relies on your powers of observation and deductive reasoning.

You will find clues in the exhibition's period rooms, in overheard conversations, and even in the air you breathe. Record your observations, hypothesize about surprises and details, and work together to put the pieces of the puzzle together to reveal whodunit. (Don't worry, excellent English actors will solve it for you in a consultation at the very end!)
