

WWII Women Code Breakers: Part 1 - England's Bletchely Park and Enigma



Only recently have the contributions of women in breaking the Nazi and Japanese codes in WWII been documented and appreciated. The British women in Bletchely Park were the first followed by women in the U.S. The absence of women from the historical record is partly due to the long duration of secrecy about code breaking and partly because after the war, most went back to their “customary female roles” when the men came back.
