

# See Superpower Dogs at the Super Science Museum



One of the great things about science is that it never stands still and the Science Museum of Minnesota is our own exemplary example of how science always move forward. We are so lucky to have such an excellent facility in our state!

There have been major changes in personnel, exhibits and even the wonderful Omnitheater, currently showing **"The Superpower Dogs."** You can follow six of the world's boldest four-legged heroes as they brave earthquakes and avalanches, protect endangered species like rhinos and elephants, and transform lives. For instance, Ricochet is a surf and therapy legend in California that heals people with special needs. Reef is a Newfoundland lifeguard in the Italian Coast Guard. Henry is an avalanche rescue expert saving lives in the mountains of British Columbia.

In addition to the movie, you will get a guided tour of some of the hidden treasures at the museum featuring the ancient animals of the Dakotas; billion, not million, year old fossils; the remains of animals living when MN was under the vast Western Inland Sea; and the unique features of some of the most ferocious animals that ever lived including *T. Rex* and the flying pterosaur, *Quetzalcoatlus*, both in the lobby. There are elevators, places to sit in the areas we'll be discussing but you are also free to strike out on your own to explore the many exhibits. Don't miss the **"Body Worlds RX"** exhibit with more than 100 plastinated human body specimens and healthy and diseased organs displayed side-by-side to illustrate the differences.
