

## Nazi Megaweapons on the Ground in WWII (Part 2)




The Nazi MegaWeapons employed on WWII on the ground were just as inventive as those used at sea (Part I) and in the air (Part III). The Atlantic Wall extended south from Norway down through Normandy and the Channel Islands. Unlike the devastation around Normandy, the mighty Nazi bunkers are still standing on the Channel Islands and are now, ironically, serving as tourist attractions.

Inland from the Normandy D-Day beaches is the Maisy Battery. Its rediscovery and importance are hugely significant events yet most people have never heard of the Maisy Battery. Why?



One of the MegaWeapons that was fortuitously bombed to ruins was the Supergun, 25 barrels shooting high velocity shells that would have destroyed London and won the war for the Third Reich. The story of its destruction includes the famous English inventor, Barnes Wallace, and Joseph P. Kennedy, Jr., yes, that Kennedy who might have been the first Catholic U.S. president.
