Tour One: 301 Summit Avenue, St. Paul

Learn about this interesting house on a beautiful boulevard with a house history of bankers, Benedictines, Bach, bratwurst and bier.



Tour Two: Cathedral of St. Paul (just 5 blocks east of 301)



Visiting a cathedral in a European city is a “must-do” on a visitor’s list. Now learn about this beautiful and distinctive Roman Catholic church, the sixth largest cathedral in the United States, right here in St. Paul.

Arrive at 301 Summit Avenue, the home of the Germanic American Institute, **by 11:00 AM** for a house tour by the (self-named) Haus Historian, Margie Deutsch. Hear about the three entities who have called this house a “home.” The house was first owned by a family of 4, then it became a monastery for 178 nuns, and now is the home for 1,000+ GAI members.

Bring your own lunch. We will eat in the GAI dining room, then walk to the Cathedral for a 1:00 PM guided tour of the church.

When we return to 301 Summit, we will follow the German custom of midafternoon dessert and coffee before we go back home.
