

## LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

As we move from the February thaw to a March spring, both snow and rain seem to be in short supply. Without extensive resort snow-making capabilities throughout the state, many of our alpine/cross country and snow shoeing outings could have turned into hiking or camping experiences. Not to be deterred, there are still lots of winter/spring activities on the 2012 ULLR event schedule.

Weather permitting, Thursdays at Welch, snow shoeing, cross country skiing, and hiking are still planned events. Not dependent upon snow are the many and varied other ULLR events, i.e. the Science Museum, singles activities, Tuesday bridge, and folding parties. Thanks to all those volunteers who headed up ULLR activities so far in 2011-12.

And so we make the transition from winter to spring/summer with the bike planning party on March 18 hosted by John Stiefel and Patty Fitzgerald. Already announced are summer bike trips on the Paul Bunyan Trail June 6-8 and Bike the Heartland Trail in Park Rapids, July 16-19. For the first nine miles, an asphalt paved path flows through hills, valleys, and curves and then levels out to a paved railroad bed for ten miles into Hackensack. It is still early in the season, but put this new trip on your summer biking schedule.

Special thanks to Karen Gray, Executive V.P., for standing in for me at the January General Meeting while I did some western skiing, and again at the February General Meeting when I was checking out the slopes in the High Sierras at Mammoth Mountain.

If you talk to any of the current board members, I'm sure we will all tell you what a great experience it is to serve on the board. I have made many new contacts and friends,



**Includes:** Monday thru Wednesday nights lodging and social hours with beverages and appetizers each evening. Each cabin has a kitchen. There is room for 23 individuals, but additional rooms (non-housekeeping motel rooms) could possibly be added.

Reviving a past traditional trip run by Rita and Bob, six house keeping cabins have been reserved at the Riverside Point Resort Motel which is the same place where we stayed years ago. The cabins are located on Fish Hook River. There is swimming in clean water so we will be able to cool down after our bike rides.

**From the DNR website:** "The Heartland State Trail was one of the first rail-to-trail projects in the country. It is a 49 mile multiple use trail between Park Rapids and Cass Lake. The paved trail is located entirely on a level abandoned railroad grade except for a four mile segment north of Walker, on sharply rolling terrain."

The Paul Bunyan Trail intersects with The Heartland Trail north of Walker. "At 112 paved miles (from Brainerd to Bemidji), the Paul Bunyan State Trail is the longest

continuously paved trail in the Minnesota State Trail system, and one of the longest in the United States." (See [www.dnr.state.mn.us/state\\_trails/heartland/index.html](http://www.dnr.state.mn.us/state_trails/heartland/index.html))

ULLRs also have the option of driving 30 minutes to Itasca State Park for 20 miles of paved trails.

**From the West:** Exit I-494 onto France Avenue; Turn right (south) Drive one short block. Turn left (east) onto American Blvd. Turn right (south) on Xerxes Avenue. Turn right (west) onto 82nd Street. Drive to York Avenue.

**From the East:** Exit I-494 onto Penn Avenue; Turn left (south). Turn right (west) onto 82nd Street. Drive to York Avenue.

*8201 York is at the corner of 82nd Street and York Avenue. The driveway is on 82nd Street.*
