I don't know when the first newsletter was printed. Perhaps a typist would cut letters into a dark blue stencil (after having made necessary corrections using correction fluid,) then placed the stencil on the mimeograph machine. Thus



multiple pages were printed. In the 70s an easier method was used, a ditto machine.



Kinkos, a new kind of copy center, opened to serve college students. Now a page could be produced containing words, hand-drawn pictures and photos. In the 1978-1979 Nullrs, the editor, Jan Walter, thanked all of the members who had helped with these issues. There were 11 typists, some articles were submitted already typed. There were 8 artists, and 8 members who cut around the outlines of members in photographs. All of these texts and pictures in various sizes and fonts were then pasted onto sheets of paper and then copied. Now the newsletter had graphics. (My goodness, when I and my computer took on this newsletter in July 2011, I didn't realize I was replacing **27 people!**)

The ULLR Directory lists the past presidents. Here, are the past Nullr editors for which I have

names. 1978- Jan Walter, 1979- Kay Bixby & Bob Glancy, 1980- Nancy Anderson & Jean Aichele, 1981& '83- Fran Radick, 1982- Vicki Turner. 1994- Carol Magnuson (She said now the Nullr text and graphics were done 95% on the computer) and 1997. 1995- Linda Heintz, 1996- Lorri Christenson. These previous editors served one-year terms to avoid burn out. 1998-99- Alan Moore; 2000-2002-Joyce Crozier; 2002-2008- Wendy Jorgenson Kooda. Lorri Christenson edited the June & August 2008 issues until Karen Oakland took on the role Sept. 2008-May 2011.

My husband Manfred was a skier. In 2003 I urged him to join a local ski club. About in 2007 I joined. In 2010 we were recruited to be Folding Party chairs. The summer of 2011, a Nullr editor was needed. At a picnic in July I was asked to do this. I would be paid \$200 a month. (I had no idea that previously there was no salary for any ULLR, including the webmaster.) I was told that I could never be named "ULLR of the Year" because of the payment. Now 13 years and 135 issues later I believe being the Nullr (everything) I was an important unifier for the Club. I thank Nancy Sand for proofing the Nullr for 11 years, making it an almost perfect edition every month.

I nominate all of the many Ullrs who have worked on the Nullr for a new award,
Ullrs of the Years!
